Moved and Seconded: Minutes of the March 2020 WIARC meeting:

MASSACHUSETTS DISTRACTED DRIVING LAW

(from the ARRL New England Section Report)

(This may or may not be relevant in Illinois, but it is instructive -.ed)

The best ways to avoid being ticketed for your lawful use of amateur radio while mobile is to have the appropriate documentation in the vehicle with you. The first item to print out and have with you in the car is the actual text of the Massachusetts General Law on the subject. That would be MGL Part 1, Title XIV, Chapter 90, Section 13. The second item is your valid FCC amateur radio license. More detail

W9EXJ tribute

Dave Nagel, W9EXJ, became a Silent Key on Friday, March 13. Services for Dave were held on Friday, March 20. Due to the nature of the COVID-19 crisis, many were not able to attend the services. The following item was included during the visitation:

Dave was known by many names: Son, Husband, Father, Grandfather, Coworker, Friend. To many, he was known only as "Dave", plus his ham radio callsign, W9EXJ. No other individual was ever assigned W9EXJ by the FCC; and this, plus the holder's first name, is often the only designation used in the amateur radio community. Dave was an amateur radio, or "ham", operator for over 72 years. He was a member of the national organization of amateur radio for over 50 years and a long-time member of the OM International Sideband Society. He was a long-time member of the Western Illinois Amateur Radio Club here in Quincy. Every ham operator has a story relating to his first experiences on the air. I'd like to quote some of Dave's story from his profile on one of the ham radio internet sites:

"I received my Class B Amateur Radio license in July of 1948 as W9EXJ. A year later I received my Class A Amateur Radio license. Back in those days you usually bought a receiver and built your transmitter and power supply. I upgraded my Class A to advanced, then recently in 2007 I upgraded to Amateur Extra Class.

Prior to taking the exam, my father bought me a Hallicrafters S-20R receiver. He paid \$50 for that receiver, which was a lot of money in those days. I built a transmitter and power supply. My station was all set up awaiting my FCC license. In June of 1948, I went to Chicago with my friend Lee Gray and took the FCC exam. I waited 6 weeks for them to send me a letter; it would say I either passed or failed. I was at church camp when it finally arrived; but when I got home, my father was waving the letter in his hand. I dropped my bags at the front door and opened the letter. Well, I passed and received my current call sign, W9EXJ. Leaving my bags at the door, I immediately ran upstairs to my room where my station was set up. Using CW [Morse Code], I began making contacts."

Dave's account of that long wait between the exam and the license is familiar to a lot of us "old timers"! His thrill of making those first contacts as a 16-year-old has a feel of familiarity.

Over the years, Dave participated in many "nets", or on-air gatherings of likeminded hams. Some of those held a regular roll call for members. Those who had passed on are known as "Silent Keys" because their signals are no longer heard on the air by their friends. A tribute is sometimes held to honor their memories in a Silent Key service where their callsign is called three times and then the announcement is made, "Nothing heard. Silent Key." Sometimes the letters "SK" are sent in Morse Code to indicate "End of Contact".
