June meeting note: As of this writing (May 21), no decision has been reached concerning the June 3 meeting of WIARC. Watch the club reflector and check into the Wednesday night nets for the latest information. -.ed

Field Day: After consulting with members of the HARC, the decision for 2020 ARRL Field Day is as follows: All club members of both clubs are encouraged to get on the air during the event, which begins at 1 pm local on Saturday June 27 and ends at 4 pm Sunday June 28. There will be no joint operation as "social distancing guidelines" remain in effect in both Illinois and Missouri at this writing. Go to http://www.arrl.org/field-day for details and rules. There will be an opportunity on the web submission for each entrant to list your local club membership (either WIARC or HARC). The FD committees of the two clubs plan to recognize entrants with the highest submitted scores overall and the highest scores for phone, CW and digital entries.

Here is some more information from W9JJ:

Don Vary of HARC passed this along:

ARRL staff together with the ARRL Board's Programs and Services Committee (PSC) discussed 2020 Field Day (FD) at length in recent weeks and affirmed the current published event rules.

Please understand that the FD Rules are not merely a staff clerical document – ARRL Directors and Committee Members are engaged in establishing each year's Field Day profile. Rules changes are very much a process that include ARRL Board Members.

In developing the FD 2020 package, the key points discussed by staff and the board committee re-emphasize that FD is not a contest (no logs are collected {only dupe sheets}, and no awards are issued) - that it is in fact an emergency communications exercise - and that when faced with any situation where Radio Amateurs are requested to supply communications assistance, we determine (we ask) how we can assist within the scope of the event and the Served Agency's needs. Then we Adapt to the needs of the event.

The same is the case with 2020 FD - this year we Adapt to the needs of the situation, while closely monitoring/following local, state and federal guidelines. As FD remains over a month away, and as communities across our country begin reopening to a new normal, each area is different – and local guidelines are different from area to area, and ever changing. Groups and individuals must determine for themselves if they are allowed to assemble, how large such groups are permitted to be, and if they can assemble safely and socially-distanced based on location options and local and state guidelines.

The rules that have been publicized for FD 2020 are unchanged from the previous several years. "Stories" have been added at www.arrl.org/field-day to expand on what may be possible in this unprecedented year. A couple more stories are planned.

As Field Day is not a contest, the Contest Advisory Committee (CAC) is not tasked to

supply input for any parameters of this event. The Distributed Multi-Op profile suggested is again something for contesting - and as FD is not a contest, it is not applicable.

Unless congregating in numbers is limited or prohibited by a locality or state, there is nothing inappropriate about club members going to a FD site that is minimally staffed – maintaining social distancing, using PPE, and disinfecting equipment – ensuring local and state guidelines and health safety standards are employed.

Other examples might be where self-contained band/mode stations – where say operators are specific to only that station - set up at the Field Day site, all within the limits of the 1,000 foot circle (say like pieces of a pie), perhaps with tents, or with Rover Vans, or with RVs – each setting up their own antennas, running their own generator or connecting to a common one, operating on their own where intercommunication between stations is by voice socially distanced or by radio – again all set-up/take-down or operating being done practicing social distancing as well. In the end, each participant needs to consider and decide if he/she will participate with due consideration to social-distancing procedures/protocols, and PPE and disinfecting resources available and needed to maintain their own personal safety above all else.

As to Home stations and FD categories: Class D is a home station using commercial power – this remains unchanged; those who can add solar, or a battery power source, or a generator, can become a Class E home station running (non-commercial) emergency power.

As FD is not a contest, it's not just about the destination - but is as much about the journey. FD 2020 is indeed a year of change, to try something different than the usual - to try something completely new - to Adapt.

While we won't be joining you in your zoom conference, do feel free to send along by email any questions the group may have (questions not answered within the current FD package or stories or herein) and we will review, research them as necessary, and reply to them in kind in a timely fashion.

4J Azerbaijan. Look for hams using 4J75 or 4K75 to celebrate the 75th anniversary of the victory in WW2. Also, two special event stations will be on the air during the Covid-19 pandemic, with calls 4J0STAYHOME and 4K0STAYHOME. QSL via DC9RI.

4X Israel. Another special event station signing 4X2BESAFE will be on the air until August 12th on various HF bands. QSL via 4Z1TL direct.

5W Samoa. Look for 5W1SA using the special callsign 5W19STAYSAFE during the pandemic. QSL via LoTW.

5Z Kenya. Another pandemic special event callsign 5Z4STAYHOME is on the air from Kenya. QSL via the Bureau. For more information see https://qsl.net/arsk.

6Y Jamaica. One more special event, by 6Y5HN, using call 6Y6STAYHOME. QSL via EA5GL.

75th Anniversary of WWII. Listen for lots of special event stations during the month of May, celebrating the 75th anniversary of WWII. Check out the OPDX Bulletin for a complete list.

9J Zambia. Look for Mario IZ3KVD signing 9J2MYT. He's been on 20/17/15/10 meters SSB. QSL IZ3KVD direct.

9M2 West Malaysia. Listen for more special event callsigns on the air for three months starting May 15th, including 9M4StayHome, 9M4DudukRumah and 9M4Covid19.

9V Singapore. 9V1STAYHOME will be on the air through June 30, to promote social distancing in the battle against Covid-19. QSL via LoTW.

A6 United Arab Emirates. Emirates ARS will activate twelve stations signing A60NMT/1 through A60NMT/12 during the pandemic.

BV Taiwan. A special event station BV120SU till be active until August 4th.

CE Chile Several special event stations signing stay at home will be on from Chile. Jorge CE3YP will be active signing CB3STAYHOME on 80-10 meters on FT8. 3G2HOME is also on the air and CB3SH will be on until September 30th.

CE9 Antarctica. Listen for 8J1RL and RI1ANM until early 2021.

DU Philippines. The Philippine ARA will put DX0STAYHOME on the air. QSL via DX1PAR.

F France. The French Radio club will activate TM18JUIN in May and June. QSL via F4AHN.

G England. The RSGB Contest Club will activate GB1945PE, GB1945PJ and GB75PEACE May through August to celebrate Victory in Europe.

LA Norway. The Norwegian National Guard's RAC will sign LN1V during all of 2020 to mark the 75th anniversary for the liberation of Norway in WW2.

OD Lebanon. Look for Radio Amateurs of Lebanon to activate OD50SH and OD5STAYHOME during the Covid—19 pandemic.

OE Austria. Martti OH2BH will sign 4U2STAYHOME from the UN International Center.

PY Brazil. Special event call ZW8THANKS will be active as a tribute to health care professionals fighting Covid-19.

S5 Slovenia. The Radio Club Cerkno will activate S500E throughout 2020.

SV Greece, SZ3STAYHOME will be on the air from Greece.

T8 Palau, T88JH will be on the air from Koror Island (OC-009) until September 17-28.

TG Guatemala. YUS1RM is active as TG9/YS1RM.

UT Ukraine. Memorial stations EO100A, EM100ALK and EM100LK will be on from the Ukraine.

VE Canada, VO2IR will be active as CH2IR until June 20, and Canadian stations are allowed to use special prefixes from: VA to CF, VE to CG, VO to CH and VY to Cl. Look for VE2EH to be active as XM2STAYHOM (no "E").

VU India. VU2KWJ will be on signing AT2TNX to thank the pandemic front line fighters. VU2UUU will activate AT2SHI. And another special event will b AU2IAG until July 16th. AT2GOK and AU2COV will be on until July 26th. VU2NTL will be on the air as AT9SS.

XU Cambodia. BG9XD is active as XU7AMG until June 14th.

YI Iraq. YI/IU5HWS will be on the air for 4-5 months.

ZL New Zealand. For the duration of the lock down, New Zealand amateurs may use the ZM prefix instead of ZL.

ZS South Africa. ZS1820S will be on for the rest of the year.

Only three entries were received. Is anyone else getting on the air? If you were a net NCS, you can at least claim the contacts of check-ins! Remember that you may use repeater contacts and any band and mode, and you may use the web to look up missing information; e.g., the state, county or grid of the stations worked if those constitute multipliers for a given month.

First of all, a correction from April: (remember, you are responsible for scoring your own log; I don't need that much entertainment. .-ed)

In reading the WIARC newsletter, I just noticed I forgot to include States, which are also multipliers. So instead of 8 mult's, I had 43 mults (which includes 35 states). Total WIMSPRINT score 4,687. 73, Cliff K0CA
