Moved and Seconded: Minutes of the April 2021 WIARC Meeting

The April 2021 meeting of the WIARC was held on Wednesday, April 7, 2021 at Twin Oaks Club on Bonansinga Drive in Quincy. The meeting was called to order at 7:01 p.m. by Vice-President W9WE in the absence of the President.

Members present were N9JF, W9WE, KD0DKE, W9GQK, WA9GBC, WB9EWM, K9VXD and (by Zoom call) NA9Q, NB4C, K9AJC and WB9WAJ.

The minutes of the March meeting were approved as printed in *The Feedline*.

The Treasurer's Report was delivered by K9VXD and approved on a motion by WB9EWM, a second by W9GQK and carried. Income for January and February consisted of membership dues and bank interest. Expenses were for dues to the Illinois Repeater Association. Details of the report are available to current members upon request.

The Executive Committee has not met.

The Repeater Board has not met. A meeting is pending to elect a new chair and to address current questions.

Contest Committee: The "Illinois Edible Awards" have been mailed to 15 of the 17 winners, with the other two pending due to being overseas shipping. A bill for \$182.70 for the purchase and shipping of the 2020 prizes was presented for payment. Though a general approval for ILQP prize expenses was included in the last budget, approval for this specific bill was given on a motion by K9VXD, seconded by WB9EWM and carried. The future of the "Illinois Edible Awards" will be discussed by the ILQP committee and the subject brought to a meeting of the membership prior to the publishing of the rules for the 2021 event.

W9WE appointed the following to the ILQP Committee: WB9EWM, WA9GBC, N9JF and W9WE.

Club Station report: Access is still not granted by Red Cross to their building. Antennas need work, and the new tribander is awaiting erection.

WA9GBC mentioned that a key card that was in the possession of former president David Gill (SK) and should be deactivated at the ARC office.

Mention was made that we need to have a second signature on the bank card. N9JF and K9VXD will follow up on this. *Note: W9DP's signature is on the card. -.ed*

Applications for membership: KA9WTK was approved for membership on a motion by WB9EWM, seconded by W9GQK and carried.

NA9Q asked about the status of the club website.

NA9Q mentioned that club member KG9W is currently a resident in the Barry Community Care Center and would probably welcome visitors.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:40 p.m. on a motion by WB9EWM, seconded by WA9GBC and carried.

Parks and such.....

With the coming of "decent weather" (we can hope), it's time to get out and activate some parks, refuges and monuments. See <u>https://wwff.co/</u> and <u>https://pota.us/#/</u> for details of each program. Be sure to read the FAQ sections before activating and sending in a log. The park lists are basically identical up to a point but diverge widely after about park 4448. There are nearly 6000 parks in the USA in the WWFF system and over 8000 in the POTA system.

Top "activators" in the USA are closing in on 100,000 QSOs (N4CD), and top "hunters" have worked over 2600 different entities (KG8P). You can find park activators just about any day of the week and from before sunup to well after dark, and that's just the USA operators! WWFF in particular has been going gangbusters in Europe for many years. If you activate a park, particularly on CW, early in the day on twenty meters, you're just about guaranteed to attract a European pileup.

Upcoming Contests:

If you get a "hankerin" to operate on a particular weekend, here are some opportunities:

May 1 and 2: Indiana QSO Party, 7th Call Area QSO Party, Delaware QSO and New England QSO Party. Take your pick, or take all of them! I think you can log all of them in

one file with N1MM+ and send the same log to everybody. They'll sort out what they need. Don't ask me how this works, and don't ask me to do the same for ILQP!

If FT8 and FT4 are your thing, try the VHF-UHF FT8 Activity Contest or the RSGB FT4 Contest Series on May 5. Note that the logs for the RSGB contest *are due 24 hours after the contest ends!!*

May 8: The Arkansas QSO Party, and Io and behold, another VHF-UHF FT8 thingie....

May 15: Something international? Try His Majesty King of Spain Contest (CW).

May 21: The Hamvention QSO Party. This one should be fun. You were going to do *something* "radio-ish" that weekend, right?

May 29 and 30: CQ WPX CW contest. LOTS of CW activity, everybody-works-everybody!

AZERBAIJAN, 4J. Special event station 4J880M is QRV to commemorate the 880th anniversary of the birth of 12th century Persian Sunni Muslim poet Nizami Ganjavi. QSL direct to 4J3DJ.

ENGLAND, G. Special event station GB0DOE is QRV until May to honor the memory of the recently deceased Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh. QSL via GB0DOE. (Catch this one quickly....says "until May"....)

JAPAN, JA. Special event station 8N1MORSE is QRV until February 28, 2022 to celebrate the 230th anniversary of the birth of Samuel F. B. Morse and the 120th anniversary of Guglielmo Marconi's first successful transatlantic radio communication by Morse Code. QSL via bureau.

ANTARCTICA. Mark, W5MED is QRV as KC4USV from McMurdo Station on Ross Island, IOTA AN-011, until October. He is active on 20 meters using SSB and FT8 at various times of the day. QSL direct to K7MT.

FALKLAND ISLANDS, VP8. Clint, VP8DKP is usually QRV on 40 meters using FT8 during his evenings. QSL direct.
