We also have a decent club station that would be a great spot for some of our club members that do not have a station at home.

A few months back, we agreed to purchase a variety of new ARRL Amateur Radio books to donate to the Quincy Public Library. I hope to have those delivered before the next meeting.

Announcing the 2022 Illinois QSO Party!

As mentioned above by The Prez, the ILQP will be on Sunday October 16 (noon) until 8 pm. The committee has recently met and made a few minor changes to the rules. The main ones are the adding of an "Unlimited" category and the elimination of the Illinois Edibles Award (adding a special certificate instead). Updated rules will appear on the club website soon.

Operating in ILQP doesn't have to be complicated. It can be as simple as tuning your two meter rig to 146.55 and listening for someone calling "CQ ILQP" from noon until 8

pm and responding with your call and your county. It can involve sitting at your HF radio for a few sessions during that eight-hour period and calling stations on 20 or 40 meters who are soliciting contacts. It can be a few hours of meeting with other club members at the club station to put W9OAB on the air. Or it can morph into an all-out obsession that takes one 400 miles on a Sunday afternoon and evening or into the brush to set up a Field Day style station on a county corner. Ask me how I know....

Whatever your style, be sure to read the rules and include all of the required information in your log for each contact, and send your log to n9jf@arrl.net.

However you do it, you contribute to the overall success of the club-sponsored event. WIARC took over the sponsorship quite a few years ago. Here you can also find the planned operations for this year's event, past results, rules, the procedure for subscribing to the ILQP reflector (recommended) and Frequently Asked Questions.
