Presidential Static from the Shack of WM4D

In the past many of our members have served as president multiple times and for multiple years. Certainly, there are more experienced and qualified members but due to job, family, travel, church, and other obligations are unable to commit the time. When Jim Funk called, and asked if I would consider an office, it was decided this would be a good time to step up to the plate. This will be my second term as president, the last being over 12 years ago when the club was still meeting at the old Hospital which has since been demolished. I am happy to serve and looking forward to contributing what I can in 2023.

My lifelong interest in ham radio has been primarily working DX and setting up portable antennas and operating while on camping trips. WM4D is my FCC assigned call and is not a vanity. More details are on my QRZ page. When my grandson KM9DX became interested in Parks on the Air I drove him around to several parks before getting involved myself. Suddenly I found myself interested in the "POTA" program and returned to activate many of those parks. After years of relative inactivity, my grandson and the POTA program have rekindled my enthusiasm for amateur radio.

Should you be interested in DX on any level, there is an opportunity coming up in late January which you definitely should not miss. Bouvet Island is among the rarest DX entities and historically has been activated only once every 10 -11 years. It is the most remote island in the world, and the expense and difficulty of reaching this location has proved extremely challenging. The last two attempts to activate Bouvet have failed. One expedition failed due to engine problems on the transport vessel; and in another attempt, by a separate group, the vessel was severely damaged in bad weather and returned to South Africa without landing on the island. Hundreds of thousands of dollars were spent on each of these attempts.

Past Bouvet activations "DXpeditions", some good, some bad, have not elevated this island out of the top five most wanted locations in the world. This upcoming attempt in late January at activating Bouvet is well-funded with an experienced crew. As of this writing, the group is now fully funded at \$715,000. If all goes well, they will be on the island for 3 weeks and everyone should have a shot at making a contact. If you're new to ham radio and have never experienced a "pileup" [hundreds of stations calling the DX at the same time] the opening days of this operation should prove to be brutal. I need this one for an ATNO "All Time New One" and plan to be in the hunt. Listen first, then jump in and give it a shot.

ROTUMA, 3D2. Antoine, 3D2AG/p has been active on 17 meters using CWaround 2240z, and on 15 meters using CW after 2300z. QSL via 3D2AG.

TANZANIA, 5H. JP, VU2BGC is QRV as 5H5PJ from Iringa. Activity is in his spare time. He has been active on 20 meters using CW. His length of stay is unknown. QSL via LoTW.

SENEGAL, 6W. Earl, WA3DX will be QRV as 6W1/WA3DX from Dakar and Mbao, and as 6W6/WA3DX from Kaolack and Marloj, from December 22 to January 20, 2023. Activity will be holiday style on 40 to 10 meters using FT8 and some SSB. QSL direct to home call.

New General Class Question Pool coming July 1, 2023

ARLB023 New General Question Pool Released for Ham Radio Licensing Effective July 1, 2023

The National Conference of Volunteer Examiner Coordinators' (NCVEC) Question Pool Committee (QPC) has released the 2023 - 2027 General Class FCC Element 3 Syllabus and Question Pool to the public. The new General Question Pool is effective July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2027.

The new pool incorporates some significant changes compared to the 2019 - 2023 version. Its 432 questions were modified slightly to improve wording and to replace distractors; 51 new questions were generated, and 73 questions were eliminated. This resulted in a reduction of 22 questions, bringing the total number of questions in the pool down from 454. The level of difficulty of questions is more balanced, and the techniques and practices addressed have been updated.

The pool is available as a Microsoft Word document and PDF online at, http://www.ncvec.org/page.php?id=369. The single graphic required for the new General Question Pool is available within the documents, or separately as PDF and JPG file formats.

"The newly revised pool must be used for General-class license exams starting July 1, 2023," said ARRL VEC Manager Maria Somma, AB1FM, who is a member of the NCVEC Question Pool Committee. "New test designs will be available to ARRL Volunteer Examiners on that date.

The ARRL VEC will supply its officially appointed, field-stocked VE teams with new General exam booklet designs around mid-June."


