Moved and Seconded: Minutes of the October 2024 WIARC meeting

The October 2nd, 2024, meeting of WIARC was called to order at 7:00 pm by Dave KB9FIN, Vice President, with the following members and guests present: KB9FIN, KD9PPJ, K9AJC, W9WE, WA9GBC, KD9VUW, KB9GIY, KD0HDL, AA9GL, WM4D, W9MDB, W9DP, WD9UFO and Paula, N9JF and NB4C on Zoom.

Introductions were made...

Ron AA9GL motioned to accept the September meeting minutes, seconded by Allan K9AJC, motion accepted by membership present.

Treasurers Report: Jack KD9PPJ reported that the club checking account had \$4441.00, and the 2 CDs were \$5000.00 and \$6166.00. The CD in Hannibal US Bank is coming due/matures on October 11th, 2024, and will be moved to the Mercantile Bank in Quincy, that has all the other club accounts. KD9PPJ stated he wanted to move some of the checking account money into a CD, discussion was had with members. KD9PPJ made the motion to move \$2000.00 into a CD and seconded by Dave WA9GBC and accepted by membership present.

Repeater Board: John WB9EWM was not present but Dave KB9FIN had notes from WB9EWM. KB9FIN reported that at the last meeting we had discussed replacing the 94 repeaters duplexer. After research the minimum cost would be at least \$2100.00 if not more. Suggested that since the 94 repeater is functioning properly at this time, we just need to keep our eyes open for a set of used duplexers that would meet our needs. Used duplexers are available from \$500.00 to \$1000.00 dollars, far less expensive than the \$2100.00 plus. Adams County Emergency Management also has some duplexers left over from older county radios equipment. WB9EWM noted he will check to see if those older duplexers would work for us and if they could be converted and work for the club they would be free.

Membership Committee: Jim N9JF noted that the club had 68 paid members. Dave W9WE brought up that the roster on the WIARC web page is from 2021 and in need to update

that. N9JF will send Andy KA0SNL a new file with an updated club roster to be updated on the website. A question came up about the website and the payment method for membership on the website, W9WE stated that he was still working on it. Comment was made again about Stripe and KD9PPJ made the statement that the Stripe payment system is a one-way system only. No one could get online and try to take any monies out of the Stripe payment system. Hoping that all the work to complete the online payment process will be done for the next upcoming year.

There were no applications for membership at this time.

Club Station: Dave KB9FIN reported that the club station was cleaned up and organized for the Red Cross open house. One computer is back online. The one computer is a windows 7 operating system and Dave WA9GBC stated that the other was a Windows 10 operation system that was with the Elecraft radio. KB9FIN stated that nothing was done at this time with the K3 radio, was waiting for WA9GBC to make sure all was connected properly.

Contest Committee: N9JF spoke about the Illinois QSO party on October 20th, 2024. N9JF stated that Danny W9DP has been updating the map and has been trying to get all the information passed on. N9JF explained what the ILQSO party is all about to some of the new members. Spoke briefly about some of the locations where club members were going to be.

EXAM SESSION WIARC

11/09/2024

Candidates must bring the following items to the session: FRN #. Copy. Please leave it with me when you leave the test.

A valid & legible written email address for contact information. Amateur radio licensees and candidates will have to provide the FCC with an email address on applications, effective sometime in mid-2021. If no email address is included, the FCC may dismiss the application as defective.

The FCC is fully transitioning to electronic correspondence and will no longer print or provide wireless licensees with hard-copy authorizations or registrations by mail. This is a new FCC requirement.

Applying for a new Amateur Radio license?

Register in <u>CORES</u> (COmission REgistration System) and receive your FRN (Federal Registration Number) before sitting for your exam to ensure your new license is processed quickly and easily through the FCC's ULS (Universal Licensing System). To conduct business with the FCC, you must register through FCC CORES and be assigned an FRN. This number will be used to uniquely identify you in all transactions with the FCC.

View the FCC web page New Users guide to ULS for step by step instructions on the registration process or the Commission Registration System Video Tutorials page for videos that help guide CORES users through a variety of situations. For assistance, submit a help request on the FCC website on the FCC's Support Services page or call FCC at 877-480-3201 (Mon.-Fri. 8 a.m.-6 p.m. ET)

No one may take an amateur exam for another person. It is essential that the VE Team checks a candidate's identification (ID) before allowing the candidate to sit for an exam. The candidate must present a legal photo ID. This requirement is usually met with a driver's license, but it can be a passport or other legal identification card with the candidate's photo on it.

When no photo ID is available, the candidate must present any two of the following:

- Non-photo ID/driver's license (some states still have them);
- Social Security Card;
- Birth certificate (must have the appropriate seal);
- Minor's work permit, school report card, school ID card or library card;
- Utility bill, bank statement or other business correspondence that specifically names the person; or
- Postmarked envelope addressed to the person at his or her current mailing address as it appears on the Form 605

2022 test fee of ?15.00? For the present (exact cash or check, cash preferred); two soft lead pencils; a ball point pen.

Original and a photocopy of any currently held FCC amateur radio license, original and a photocopy of any current (CSCE)

Certificate of Successful Completion of Examination. In addition, a candidate may bring and use a non-programmable calculator.

ARRL Youth Licensing Grant Program Information

Beginning April 19, 2022, ARRL will cover the one-time \$35 application fee for new license candidates younger than 18-years old for tests administered under the ARRL Volunteer Examiner Coordinator (ARRL VEC) program. The \$35 FCC application fee will be reimbursed after the <u>ARRL VEC</u> receives the completed reimbursement form and the new license has been issued by the FCC. The reimbursement check will be mailed to the fee payer. Also, candidates younger than 18-years old would pay a reduced exam session fee of \$5 to the ARRL VEC VE team at the time of the exam. The \$5 fee is for all candidates under the age of 18 regardless of the exam level taken. Proof of under 18 status is required at the session
