Moved and Seconded: Minutes of the November 2024 WIARC Meeting

The November 6th, 2024, meeting of WIARC was called to order at 7:00 pm by Dave KB9FIN, Vice President, with the following members and guests present:

Introductions were made...

John WB9EWM motioned to accept the September meeting minutes, seconded by Ron AA9GL, motion accepted by membership present.

Treasurers Report: Jack KD9PPJ reported that \$2000.00 was taken out of the checking account and added to the CD that matured in the Hannibal bank and was moved to the Quincy bank. We now have 2 CD's one with around \$5000.00 and the other with around \$6000.00 in them and checking account balance was at \$2512.26. The link for the Stripe payment system isn't up and working just yet. Stay tuned and check the club website for the payment link to go active soon. WB9EWM made the motion to accept the Treasurers report. Seconded by AA9GL and accepted by membership present.

Repeater Board: John WB9EWM reported that they had a Repeater Board meeting this evening and there were no updates or changes. The antenna off the old radio tower was at WB9EWM's home.

Membership Committee: Jim N9JF stated that there were no changes at this time with membership and that there were a couple of memberships already paid for 2025. The club had a guest, Roy Harness, no call, looking to become a member of the club. After discussion and By-Laws checked, he is going to wait till after he passes his testing before membership application is accepted.

Club Station: John WB9EWM reported that the antenna ordered through DX Engineering has been pushed back and expected delivery date is now sometime in January 2025. Dave KB9FIN reported that the station, computers were up and running and the Dual band radio was in need of programming.

Contest Committee: N9JF spoke about the Illinois QSO party on October 20th, 2024. Stated that he had 374 Logs sent to him with over 52,000 plus QSO's. N9JF also related to the membership present that he is going to change the date to turn in logs to 14 days after the QSO party starting with the 2025 ILQSO Party which is now a common practice.

ILQP Report

As I write this, the clock is ticking. ILQP logs are due in 2 hours. When the day clicks over to November 22, (midnight CST), no more logs will be accepted for scoring, and "Phase 2" kicks in. Scoring begins.

We have received 405 logs this year totaling about 54,000 QSOs. Both of these are records. Importing the logs has gone pretty well with, as usual, two percent of the logs requiring 50% of the work. The software developed and refined by WA9GBC is performing like a champ so far.

I have a request. There needs to be another individual (maybe more than one) who knows how to handle these logs and Dave's software! It doesn't require a lot of techsavvy (if it did, I wouldn't be able to do it)! It does require some time. If you're interested, please let me know!

POTA Stuff

We are moving into that period of the year when operating out on a picnic table isn't quite as much fun as it was in July, at least not in Illinois. The upside is that you don't have to deal with mosquitoes.

One can either migrate to a milder climate or change tactics, setting up the station inside a cozy vehicle and running the heater as needed.
